- **Maintaining Training Standards and Certifications of Deputies**

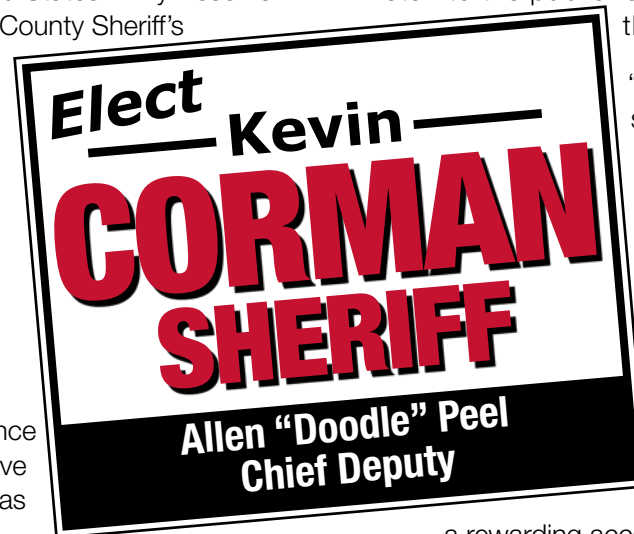

Looking Ahead: Kevin Corman's Vision for Jessamine County

- Establish a countywide Neighborhood Watch Organization; attend meetings and participate in an ongoing program identifying the critical issues of public safety and crime prevention
- Establish a stronger working partnership with the Nicholasville and Wilmore Police Departments
- Establish a directive for a countywide patrol that will enhance the Sheriff's Department's presence in all areas of the county
- Establish a Sheriff's Office Citizen's Police Academy in conjunction with the Nicholasville Police Department
- Establish a program that will provide a School Resource Officer to enhance the security and safety of our children
- Establish a Drug Enforcement Unit in an effort to get drugs off the street, and to help change/save the lives of those affected
